- 1 INSPECTION: No lot is available for inspection by post.
- 2. EXTENSION: Extensions for expertising will be granted on application. Any purchase made with an extension is payable in full in compliance with Condition 7. Such monies will not be made available to the vendor until the purchaser has received the certificate. The onus shall be on the purchaser to obtain such certificate within a reasonable time and bear all costs. If the item does not receive a clear certificate, the Auctioneer will refund any expertisation fee not exceeding \$70.
- 3. BIDDING:

3.1 Bidding, either absentee or in the room, will bind the bidder to these conditions of sale. Subject to any reserve price, the highest bidder shall purchase the lot: any dispute arising as to who is the highest bidder shall be determined by the Auctioneer who may offer the lot again. The Auctioneer may group, split up, or withdraw lots, and transfer bids to identical lots at their discretion.

- 3.2 Bidders shall be deemed to purchase as buyer unless prior to bidding they have given the Auctioneer a copy of a written authority to bid on behalf of another person.
- 3.3 Where an agent purchases on behalf of an undisclosed client, such agent shall be personally liable for payment of the purchase money to the Auctioneer and for safe delivery of the lot to the said client.

- 7. # International Numismatic Auction #31 Friday 22nd September 2023 - 12 noon

### Rare New Zealand Items Stand Out in Mowbray Sale

This 560 lot auction offers an exceptional range of hard to find coins, banknotes and error coins. World coins and notes, especially rare early twentieth century Chinese notes, gold, collections and military medals are also strengths. There is something for everyone.

The unique 1965 UK/NZ halfpenny mule, pairing the NZ reverse with the UK obverse (Est \$NZ 8000) the 1985 NZ Fifty Cents Obverse with a Canadian Dollar 1985 reverse (Est \$7000), and Twenty Cents 1975, struck on a Hong Kong Two Dollar blank (Est \$3000), provide a great line-up of rare mules.

The Waitangi Proof Set (Est \$18,000) is amongst the best we have ever offered. And we have our best ever range of rare pre-decimal proofs not offered to the public: a 1937 Sixpence (Est \$1800), 1947 Set of Halfcrown to Threepence (Est \$12,500), 1960 Proof Halfpenny (Est \$1700) and 1949 yellow Bronze Model pattern Crown (Est \$800) and more rare decimal patterns. The Kapanui Communion token, unknown to Lampard (Est \$1250) and Oamaru Obverse trial token in copper (Est \$600) provide rare opportunities too. And for Australia, the 1839 convict love token, gVF, of James Barnacle, (Est \$1000) stands out.

Of the 80 NZ banknote lots, a Wilks \$5, 002\* prefix, in aF, (Est \$300), only eight other examples are known. Higher grade early Reserve Bank pre-decimal, decimal notes, same number sets, interesting 1934 - 40 Lefeaux's and an 1845 Rowland Davis private issue Shilling, VG, at \$500 extend the range.

World banknotes include an impressive collection assembled in China in the early 20th century and brought to New Zealand. The top lot is a consecutive pair of issued "Ta-Ching" Government Bank Ten Dollars from 1906, Hankow branch, estimated to hammer at \$NZ9,000, PMG certified XF 45. Other top notes include an exceptional Hong Kong & Shanghai Banking Corporation Ten Dollars from 1920, certified as AU 50 EPQ, the finest of 42, (Est \$4000). All up there are 52 World banknote lots with 223 Chinese banknotes in 40 lots.

World coin strengths are in 20 albums and collections and Federal Republic of Germany issues, with a sprinkling of ancients. Not often seen here is a collection of 36 Paraguay 150 Guaranies 1970's silver proofs (Est \$2100) with the personalities that leapt out of the pages of World Catalogues of the time – Beethoven, Einstein, John F Kennedy, Goethe and others. China again features with a Qing, Yunnan "Packsaddle" silver ingot, (Est \$1500).

Great Britain coins offer a good hammered range including a Royalist Late Declaration Groat of Charles I, 1646, VF (Est \$1500), a pair of William & Mary and James II tin farthings gF – VF (Est \$300), a William IV groat, 1836, with 3mm offset, gVF (Est \$400), and an 1860 Penny with the colon missing with numbers thought to be as low as 4 as recently as 2009, Est \$500.

Over 100 Gold coins feature as always including the rarely seen NZ 2003 Lord of the Rings 3-coin set, Est \$12,000.

The 70 military medal lots have high interest. The Waterloo medal to John Lutter, Gunner, Royal Horse Artillery, takes you close to the front line (Est \$3500), as does the OBE Group to the Rev Richard Swann-Mason, present when the Lusitania sank and who officiated at the funeral of victims. A 13-medal group to Kiwi Major Justin McCarthy Power has amazing geographical coverage as he served from WWI to Korea over 40 years (Est \$2000). The 1860 - 61 New Zealand Medal to Lieut. S. M. Medley, H.M.S. Iris, is an unusual date (Est \$2000). Badges round out the militaria including an unusual large World Police Badge collection.

- 1 NEW ZEALAND MEDAL 1860-1861, Imperial issue, impressed LIEUT. S. M. MEDLEY, H.M.S. IRIS; MYB123, Medley was awarded this medal for his actions at Puketakauere serving aboard the HMS Iris; approx 72 medals awarded to H.M.S Iris, ex Mowbrays private sale by family members, scrs. VF/EF
- 2 NEW ZEALAND MEDAL, Imperial issue, undated although records show entitlement to 1863-66, impressed 123. EDMD. MARTINDALE. 1ST BN. 12TH FOOT., MYB123, Edmund (also called Edward) Martindale, born in Salford, enlisted with the 12th Foot on 5 Oct 1858 & was discharged as a Sergeant in England by completion of service on 11 Jan 1869, with copies of research & discharge paper. Edge bruising. VF
- 3 NEW ZEALAND MEDAL ND, officially reengraved from an Auckland Militia issue to ALEXANDER STRACHAN. ALEXANDRA CAVALRY, late issue in 1914, MYB123. Strachan, born 1846 at Comrie, Scotland, migrated to New Zealand in 1851, joining the Alexandra Cavalry in Aug 1864. He participated at Waikiwi & Waitotara (11 Jan 1865), was under fire at the first engagement at Nukumaru (24-25 Jan 1865), Otautu, near Patea, & at Kakaramea. His claim for the medal stated he had been under fire "upwards of 20 times". He also served in the Commissariat Transport Company in 1865 & stated that in 1868 he served under von Tempsky. Strachan later farmed at Lornty & died at Wellington in 1928. Stowers states there were 11 known claims for the Alexandra Cavalry, 8 known medals, scarce. gVF
- 4 NZ Group of 4, Queens South Africa (copy unnamed), British War Medal & Victory Medal, impressed 42175 CPL. J.O'NEILL. N.Z.E.F., & WW2 NZ War Service Medal. James O'Neill (spelt O'Neil in the QSA records) 1881 - 1973, enlisted with the 6th contingent for the Boer War (service no 3271). A labourer at enlistment, he was drafted from the No.3. Waikato Mounted Rifles where he reached the rank of Sergeant. He received the Queen's South Africa Medal with Transvaal, Orange Free State and Cape Colony clasps & South Africa 1901 and 1902 clasps. On 3 Jan 1917 he enlisted as a private with the 1st Brigade of the Auckland Infantry Regiment, & proceeded overseas on 2 April 1917. At enlistment he described his occupation as Bushman. He was promoted to L/Cpl on 20 April 1918, Cpl on 1 June 1918 & received a gunshot wound to his thigh in France on 3 Oct 1918. He spent the rest of the war in England. In WW2 he resigned his commission of Lieu (Temp) on 25 July 1942. With service records. EF

- 5 NZ/GB Group of 13. to Major Justin McCarthy Power 1914-15 Star. BWM, Victory Medal, 1939-45 Star, Atlantic Star, Africa Star with 8th Army Clasp, Pacific Star, Defence Medal, War Medal with MID Oak Leaf, New Zealand War Service Medal, UN Korea Medal, NZ Long and Efficient Service Medal, MYB257 & New Zealand Territorial Service Medal, MYB259, plus Army Pay book. Two medals to Power have not been found after searches - the General Service Medal 1918 with Clasp S. E. Asia 1945-46 & the British Korea Medal. Large volume of hard & soft copy research confirms the awards. Naming available in additional research notes at mowbraycollectables.com. Power (1892-1962) gave varying ages but was born in Paeroa, Ohenimuri County, New Zealand to a hotel keeper. In 1911 as a Railway Clerk he joined the Territorial Battalion of Railway Engineers, the prelude to an exceptionally long & diverse military career in supply & support.
