



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CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. INSPECTION: No lot is available for inspection by post.
2. EXTENSION: Extensions for expertising will be granted on application. Any purchase made with an extension is payable in full in compliance with Condition 7. Such monies will not be made available to the vendor until the purchaser has received the certificate. The onus shall be on the purchaser to obtain such certificate within a reasonable time and bear all costs. If the item does not receive a clear certificate, the Auctioneer will refund any expertisation fee not exceeding \$70.
3. BIDDING:
 - 3.1 Bidding, either absentee or in the room, will bind the bidder to these conditions of sale. Subject to any reserve price, the highest bidder shall purchase the lot: any dispute arising as to who is the highest bidder shall be determined by the Auctioneer who may offer the lot again. The Auctioneer may group, split up, or withdraw lots, and transfer bids to identical lots at their discretion.
 - 3.2 Bidders shall be deemed to purchase as buyer unless prior to bidding they have given the Auctioneer a copy of a written authority to bid on behalf of another person.
 - 3.3 Where an agent purchases on behalf of an undisclosed client, such agent shall be personally liable for payment of the purchase money to the Auctioneer and for safe delivery of the lot to the said client.
 - 3.4 Vendor bids shall not be accepted on their own lots.
 - 3.5 Staff and Shareholders of Mowbray Collectables may participate in this auction
4. BIDDING INCREMENTS: Absentee and online bids must comply with the following steps:

Otherwise, the regulation of bidding is at the Auctioneer's discretion.
5. ABSENTEE BIDDERS: Bids will be accepted from persons unable to attend the auction, and their bids will be treated in utmost confidence and managed as though the bidder is in the room. The Auctioneer shall not be liable for errors or omissions in executing bids. **Live online bidding** is available via auctions.mowbraycollectables.com and our mobile apps. **A 3% surcharge applies for this service, whether placed prior to, or during the auction.** Bids prior to the auction may be placed through our websites, apps or directly with us. Absentee bidders, who have not seen the lots they are buying, may reject any lot with the exception of bulk or mixed lots and collections, where the description is not in accordance with that given in the catalogue. However, any such lots are only returnable within seven days of receipt, and in the condition received.
6. ESTIMATES: Bidding will commence at a bidding increment over the second highest postal/absentee bid received prior to commencement of the auction. Where one or no bids have been received, bidding will commence at 70% of the lot estimate, or at reserve if above 70%.
7. PAYMENT: Lots will be at the buyer's risk from the fall of the hammer, but title shall not pass until payment in full has been made of the purchase price (hammer price plus 17% buyer's premium (plus GST on buyers premium for NZ buyers) and, if applicable, interest). Payment and clearance of lots by room buyers may be carried out on the day of the sale. Payment by absentee bidders must be made upon receipt of invoice. Payments not received within 30 days of the auction date will be subject to a 24% p.a. penalty interest, applied to the unpaid balance on a daily basis from the auction date. Cash payments of \$10,000 or more cannot be accepted.
8. No GST is charged on the hammer price, but purchasers outside of New Zealand undertake that neither they or an associated person will cause the goods to be re-imported into New Zealand in substantially the same condition in which they were exported.
9. FAILURE TO PAY: If the buyer breaches Condition 7, the Auctioneer, without prejudice to any other rights available to it, shall be entitled without notice to the buyer to exercise one or more of the following rights and remedies:
 - 9.1 to terminate the contract with the buyer and any monies which the buyer has paid to the Auctioneer on account of such purchase or purchases shall be forfeited;
 - 9.2 to terminate the contract, resell the lot at any time by public auction and the buyer shall pay to the Auctioneer any resulting deficiency in the purchase price (plus interest) and insurance. Any surplus shall be paid to the vendor;
 - 9.3 to apply any monies at any time due by the Auctioneer to the buyer in payment of the purchase price (plus interest). The Auctioneer shall have a lien over any property of the buyer in the possession of the Auctioneer, in order to secure any monies due to the Auctioneer; and
 - 9.4 to proceed against the buyer for damages for breach of contract.

International Numismatic Auction #36

Friday 20th March 2026 - 12 noon

Our next International catalogue is again a record with \$750,000 of estimates and 572 lots of medals, coins, banknotes, tokens and jewellery items, to suit many budgets and buyers.

Lot 1 stands out as the rarest British gallantry medal, the New Zealand Cross, to Dr Isaac Featherston, first time to market since its 1875 award, and estimated at \$200,000. Instituted in 1869 because Colonial volunteers and Māori allied with the Government were not eligible for the Victoria Cross, the New Zealand Cross was only awarded 23 times. With few available to the market, it is a once in a lifetime opportunity for buyers. Dr Featherston was the pre-eminent Wellington leader for a quarter of a century, Provincial Superintendent from 1853 to 1871, an MP, a campaigner for representative Government, respected by local Wellington Iwi leaders, and gallant under fire in battle.

Exceptionally rare is the very first Conspicuous Gallantry Medal (Flying) awarded, part of a group of seven, estimated at \$20,000. New Zealand Flight Sergeant Lesley Bruce Wallace of Invercargill earned it on 21 December 1942. Just five were awarded to kiwis and his was the first ever awarded to anyone. Other outstanding medals are the DSO and DFC group to kiwi test pilot James Bayntun Starky (Est \$12,500) and the rare Korean War Military Medal Group of 12 to kiwi Bruce Redfearn (Est \$9000) for amazing courage under fire. These medals are some of those from the collection of the late Graeme McLeod, a respected authority on official New Zealand and British Commonwealth awards.

Other medals among the ninety lots in the auction are DFCs, DCMs, and Military Crosses.


Naval awards include to George Dunn who survived three sinkings by U-Boat in World War One and a Halifax disaster pair to Arthur Bagnall, present at the largest explosion prior to nuclear weapons. Single medals include the New Zealand Medal to J C Richmond, an important politician and artist, (Est \$3000). There are also many more affordable medals.

There has been a surge of interest in gold and silver coins recently with sharp price movements. We have not adjusted estimates for most silver and gold coins given the volatility is ongoing. More than 80 gold lots, 127 World and ancient coin lots and 31 higher grade New Zealand coin lots provide choice for most collectors. Julius Caesar and Tiberius are present. A special feature is higher grade Tradesmen's tokens with a New Zealand uncirculated 1879 pattern penny and A S Wilson Penny in EF.

British coins include hammered Pennies from scarcer kings, such as William I & II from a broad collection celebrating the Penny in history by New Zealand diplomat Jim Howell, right up to proof British gold pennies struck for Elizabeth II from 2002 to 2015.

The hundred world and New Zealand banknote lots offered include a New Zealand Fleming £50 specimen No 4, with black oval specimen overprints in AU, serial R000000 and a Wilson specimen set of 4, 10 Shillings to £10, both estimated at \$3000.

Regulations for Rare NZ Objects

New Zealand's Protected Objects Act restricts exports of some objects, which sometimes may still be exported with permission. Almost all lots in this catalogue are not affected. It does affect Lot 1, the NZ Cross, and Lot 26, the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal. Export permission has been sought but may not be granted for those. Overseas bidders should check the status of these with us, or other rare items with possible social history significance. We can advise that the Maungatautari cheques in lots 483 to 485 are not taonga tūturu (restricted Māori objects requiring licences for collectors).

- 1 NEW ZEALAND CROSS to Dr Isaac Earl Featherston, engraved on reverse I. E. FEATHERSTON, no date or unit, with cartouche PHILLIPS COCKSPUR ST on reverse of suspender, silver with gold embellishments, MYB25 listed immediately after the Victoria Cross, OD16, with plain black case, first time to market. Dr Isaac Earl Featherston was awarded the New Zealand Cross on 28 October 1875 for actions in the New Zealand Wars in 1865-66, and is listed eighth on the medal roll.

Acknowledged as the rarest of gallantry awards, the New Zealand Cross was awarded 23 times to volunteers in the 1860s - 1870s New Zealand Wars. The Volunteers were ineligible for the Victoria Cross, of which 15 were awarded to British troops, and so the Colonial Government instituted the award in 1869. It was approved by Queen Victoria. The number of 23 awards understates the rarity, increased by most now being in institutional collections. The last known sale of a New Zealand Cross was in England in 2011 by Dix Noonan Webb at £115,000, with a New Zealand Medal and available to international buyers.

Dr Featherston's New Zealand Cross stands out because of his importance as a statesman. Born in Newcastle, England, in 1813, the 7th of 11 children, he qualified in medicine in 1835 at Edinburgh, & migrated to Wellington as a ship's doctor in 1839, persuaded of the virtues of the settlement by Edward Gibbon Wakefield and expecting 300 acres of land.

Finding his allocated land to be a distant swamp, he established a medical practice to earn a living. Active in the community from the outset, he became President of the Wellington Club in 1841, edited a newspaper, campaigned successfully for compensation for settlers from Wakefield's New Zealand Company and for representative Government to be established. He was elected to the colonial Parliament almost continually from 1852 – 1870 and as Superintendent of the Wellington Province from 1853 to 1871, playing a huge role in provincial development. He twice held Cabinet rank in 1861 and 1869-70 and became New Zealand's Agent-General in Great Britain from 1871, dying in office in Britain on 21 June 1876. Featherston worked to keep peace with Wellington Maori from the outset of the New Zealand Wars, but agreed to serve as leader of a Maori contingent whose members called for his leadership, from December 1865 on the North Island West Coast. *cont....*

....cont His commanding officer, General Chute, wrote in support of his New Zealand Cross award: "This officer Featherston, who volunteered to accompany me on the expedition and to take charge of the Native Allies, rendered me valuable and important assistance in every respect, and on all occasions most conspicuous for his bravery and gallantry. He was present at the capture and destruction of the following Pa, viz., Okutoko, Otapawa, Ketemarae, and Waikoko, and accompanied me in the march round Mt. Egmont. I venture to bring more particularly under the notice of your Excellency and Government the intrepid devotion of this officer to the public service on the occasion of capture of that almost impregnable stronghold the Otapawa Pa, the occupants were under the delusion it could not be taken. The conspicuous gallantry displayed by this officer in the storming of that Pa, in leading the Native Contingent into action, almost at the sacrifice of his own life, not only elicited my warmest approbation, but the admiration of the whole force present on that memorable occasion."

Two hundred Wanganui Maori were with the Government at Otapawa. Featherston's stand with a revolver was instrumental in keeping the Wanganui Maori with him, despite a breakout by the defenders of the Pa. Thirty Maori and eleven British were killed in the battle. Although he declined a knighthood, after the award, Featherston said he valued the honour of the New Zealand Cross above any that Governments had a power to confer.

Permission to export has been sought but is not guaranteed.

The Cross is sharply struck, better than most, with crimson ribbon and gold embellishments, slight edge knock to lower right reverse arm edge, minor abrasions, the case in good condition except hinges are detached. EF

- 2 NEW ZEALAND MEDAL Group (3), NZ Medal undated, impressed in small capitals SUB. INSPR. G. O'HALLORAN. A.C., VF; Kings Empire Veterans Assn Cross, Rev WORRAL & SONS AUCKLAND, OD129, EF; & Armed Constabulary Badge, Oldham1/1, lugs intact, EF. George Stuart O'Halloran (7 September 1845 - 1 December 1910, Auckland) was a Captain in the Colonial Defence Force, Wellington 3/12/1863 - 5/11/1864 & in the Patea Yeomanry Cavalry (to 16/3/1868) from 1866 to 1871. With the Armed Constabulary, he served at Opotiki 1865, Ohinemutu, & Moturoa in 1868. He was one of just 33 Armed Constabulary Officers to receive the NZ Medal. Importantly, he was present at Te Ngutu-o-te-manu when von Tempsky and O'Halloran's colleague Captain Buck were killed in 1868. He wrote an important account of his life, including that incident. With a copy of O'Halloran's extensive manuscript, photos & extensive other research. VF - EF

- 3 NEW ZEALAND MEDAL, no date, impressed HON. J.C. RICHMOND. James Crowe Richmond, an important New Zealand politician & artist, was born in 1822 in London. Richmond was apprenticed as an Engineer & served on the staff of Isambard Brunel, working on the Great Western Railway. He emigrated to NZ in 1850, reaching Taranaki & buying land which became the centre of the Richmond, Atkinson, Hursthouse & Ronald families.
- In 1858 he joined the Taranaki Volunteer Rifles. His unit was involved in the Battle of Waireka (28/3/1860) & the storming of the Manutahi Pā (Oct 1864). His wife and family were evacuated from Taranaki to Nelson in 1860 after his farm was raided & his house destroyed. He also moved & was editor of the Nelson Examiner.
- He first entered politics in the Taranaki Provincial Council in 1858, & in 1859 became Provincial Secretary. He became a member of the Nelson Provincial Council in 1864, & again was Provincial Secretary. He met the painter John Gully. They undertook at least one sketching trip together.
- In 1860 he became a member of the House of Representatives, & in 1865 the Legislative Council. He was in effect the Minister of Native Affairs (1866-69), urging compensation for the seizure of the Wellington reserves & the return of some confiscated land to former anti-government Māori in the Bay of Plenty & Taranaki. He also engaged in discussions on Waikato & Ngai Tahu land claims. His political career ended with the defeat of the Government in 1869. In various trips to England, he applied his painting skills.
- After a return in 1881 he was appointed to the Legislative Council from 1883-1892. He died at Otaki on 19/1/1898. With research, including book with colour examples of his paintings, National Art Gallery Wellington, 1991-92, & details of NZ Medal award for action as Lance Corporal Taranaki Rifle Volunteers, gazetted 1891. EF \$3,000
- 4 NZ (2), Volunteer Long Service Medal, Victoria Imperatrix, impressed CAPT. & QM.R. THOMAS C. SELF. V.D. "RETIRED LIST" N.Z. VOLS. (1904), MYB257; & NZ Long & Efficient Service Medal (Kohn type), engraved QTRMASTER THOMAS. C. SELF. UNATTACHED ACTIVE LIST N.Z. VOLS. Thomas Chambers Self (Bn about 1842, London, died Auckland 1909), migrated to Auckland in 1862 & was a tailor. In 1880 he was a Sub-Lieut of the Victoria (Auckland) Rifle Volunteers. In 1883 he was promoted to Lieutenant, & was Capt & Quartermaster from 1887. The local paper reported "The promotion of this officer cannot but be gratifying to his comrades in arms, for he is an experienced drill and competent and experienced officer and the manner in which he carried out the duties of quartermaster during the encampments at Papatoetoe and Takapuna proves the appropriateness of the promotion." gVF \$400

- 5 NZ (3), Queen's South Africa Medal, clasps Cape Colony, Orange Free State, Transvaal, South Africa 1901 & 1902, hand to F, impressed 3383 PTE H. ANDERSON. N: ZEALAND M.R.; Police LSGC, White type, NO. 1139 CONST. H. ANDERSON N.Z.POLICE. 1918; & RSA Badge numbered 3383S.A (Oldham 11/38). Henry Anderson (1880-1922) was a farmer. He enlisted on 14/1/1901 with the 17th Coy, 6th contingent of the Mounted Rifles. While in South Africa his mother enquired, noting that he was suffering from "Enteric". He was discharged on 15th May 1902 but in July still had "a chill resembling influenza". He was granted a temporary pension and some medical care at home. He was working as a police constable by 1904 & was on the Army Reserve roll for WW1. gVF \$400

On 21/3/1916, he was promoted to Major in Egypt. On 19/11/1917, he became a Quartermaster with the rank of Major, by then over 50 & not fit to serve at the front. -cont Harriet Sandland (Bn Dunedin 16/11/1871, died Auckland 15/8/1966), paid for her passage to England in June 1915. Immediately afterwards he carried an urgent report back again 500 yards across the open ground through heavy enemy shellfire." Initially a Private, he reached L/Corp on 27/2/1917, Sgt on 6/12/1917 & Provost Sergeant (in charge of the regimental police) on 21/10/1918.

By WWII, he was living in Petone when enlisting on 24 October 1940, service number 824137. He served as Sergeant Major First Class, at Trentham Military training camp. He was awarded the MM for "Acts of Gallantry in the Field" on 15/10/1917 when his unit was part of Operation Gravenstael at Passchendaele between 1/10 & 5/10/1917. The citation included: "For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. On the night of the 2nd/3rd October ... the enemy placed a barrage round Battalion Headquarters ... cut the wires on three separate occasions so that telephonic communication with the Front Line Companies was cut off. ... Lance Corporal Hayton cont....

cont.... went out through the barrage on three occasions and successfully repaired the wire although the barrage was placed so close to Headquarters that the roof was twice hit by a 5.9 shell, and a third similar shell fell right at the entrance. It was wholly owing to the bravery and devotion to duty of this Non-Commissioned Officer that Headquarters was able to keep the necessary touch by telephone with the front at such a period." He was also injured with gas on 19/2/1918.

His citation for the D.C.M. was: "For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during an attack and through severe machine gun barrage he laid a telephone wire forward. The NCO in Charge became a casualty and Sgt Hayton at once took command of all the Battalion Signal communications and when his post was severely damaged by shell fire, he established contact over an area continually swept by heavy shell fire. For two days he maintained all his lines as well as visual station to brigade headquarters, and by his organization of the means at his disposal he displayed high powers of leadership and resource."

He was discharged on 12/4/1919 & resumed work as a carpenter in Petone. He enlisted as a S/Sgt for WWII on 24/10/1940 (service no 824137), serving as Sergeant Major First Class, at Trentham Military training camp. He was discharged on 8/10/1945.

On 21 Dec 1942 his Lancaster W4193 OL-A was attacked from below. The bomb aimer and Wallace were both injured. Flares inside the aircraft were set alight. Despite his injury and with complete disregard for the danger, Wallace immediately set to work to jettison all movable burning material through the rear turret and finally subdued the fire. The Lancaster was under continuous night fighter attack & riddled with hits. Wallace only mentioned that he had taken a bullet to his leg at the end of the flight. He was given credit for the flight's safe return for doing everything possible to assist the pilot, including seeking radio fixes for the severely damaged aircraft. For this he was awarded the very first CGM (Flying), one of five awarded to NZ airmen out of the 103 awarded in World War II. (Full citation is included in extensive accompanying papers with more detail in online notes.) He returned to NZ after 46 sorties with 83 Squadron & served with 40 Sqn RNZAF (Hudson/Lodestar/Dakota) in the Pacific. He ended the war a Flying Officer.

Exceptionally rare, the CGM (Flying) is acknowledged as second only to the Victoria Cross, with a total 5 awards to New Zealanders & 112 awards in total before issue ceased. EF

But on 18/11/1942 the Lt Col commanding 26 (NZ) Bn reported he was "Working well and conduct satisfactory... and recommend successfully that the balance of the sentence be remitted".

His MM citation included: "In the vicinity of Enfidaville on the morning of 25 April 1943, the Company of which Private Dickson was a member, was ordered to dig in on the reverse slope of Srafi. At first light the enemy counterattacked and reoccupied a Machine cont....

cont.... Machine Gun post 150yds to the left of the Platoon's position. Mr Dickson went forward with his Bren Gun and exposed himself to the enemy to draw his fire and shot two of the enemy when they attempted to fire on him. He continued to expose himself and when the remainder of the gun crew attempted to shoot at him they made themselves easy targets for the Platoon on the left. Private Dickson then moved around to the right flank of the Platoon area and assisted in bringing sufficient fire to bear on an enemy Machine Gun post that they evacuated the position. Private Dickson's work was particularly important, as his Platoon had not yet dug in and their position was in full view of these two enemy posts. Later the same day Private Dickson went forward and located another Machine Gun post which was bringing fire to bear on a ridge in front of the Platoon area, and next day acted as an Observation Post for mortars, who drove the enemy out of this position. On the night of 25 April 1943 Private Dickson took up an advanced position to guard against enemy infiltration, and until the Company was finally relieved continued to move about watching for enemy movement. At no time during the 48 hours the Company was on the Ridge did Private Dickson spare himself, and his example and steady flow of humour was an inspiration to everyone."

Details of sorties include 5/9/1943 to Mannheim, bombing, being hit by flak and a fighter who set their starboard wing on fire, which burned until being put out by the petrol tank blowing up. On 19/11/1943, flak over Essen put out one engine, and the crew had to jettison to get clear.


